

ELA: review long a: ai & ay and possessives 's vs. s'; spelling test on long e words spelled ea; read aloud A *Great Artist and His Dots* and compare its theme to the theme of The Dot.

Friday: Math: ch 8 lesson 2 Compare and order lengths of objects using -er &-est endings w/ short and long ELA: Unit 4 week 2 reading test (tested on sight words & comprehension of *The Dot*)

Comprehension strategy: graphic organizers Comprehension skill: theme

Phonics: long e: ea & inflected endings –ier, ies, & -iest **Phonemic Awareness:** segment, blend, and read words w/y to i stem changes and long e spelled ea.
