


# Miss Garber's Weekly News Room 3

Comprehension skill: Realism and Fantasy
Phonics: long i: ie, igh, and kn /n/ and wr/r/
Phonemic Awareness: segment, blend, and read
words w/ long i spelled ie and igh and words w/
kn/n/ & wr/r/



#### This Week

<u>Math</u>- We will learn how to tell time to the hour and half hour using analog and digital clocks.

\*homework tips: emphasize shorter hand = hour hand b/c hour is the shorter word; time to the half hour on analogue clock the hour hand goes in btwn. 2 #s & use the smaller one.

Reading- We will review the genre realistic fiction using the text *The Lady in the* Moon, find details in the text that show it is an example of realistic fiction, & make inferences about the significance of the Moon Festival.

<u>Writing</u>- We are starting informative writing pieces about animals. Students will read informative articles and highlight details, such as their habitats, and write them in a graphic organizer.

<u>Social Studies</u>- We will compare and contrast the school environment to students' home environments and discuss why they are unique.
